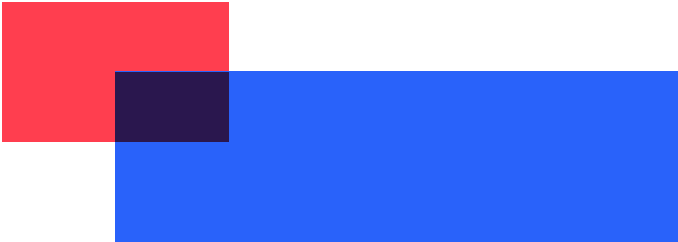
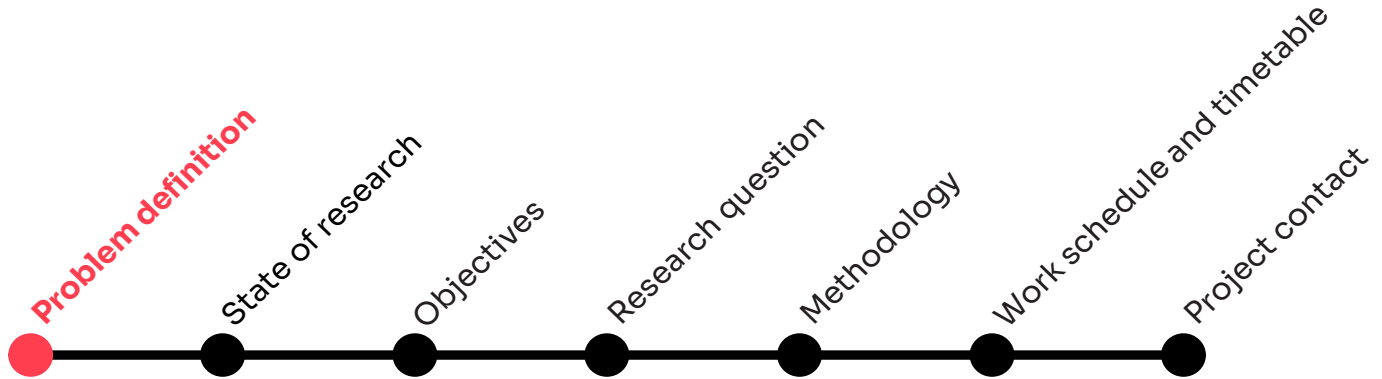


Stop Exposé

in a theoretical context



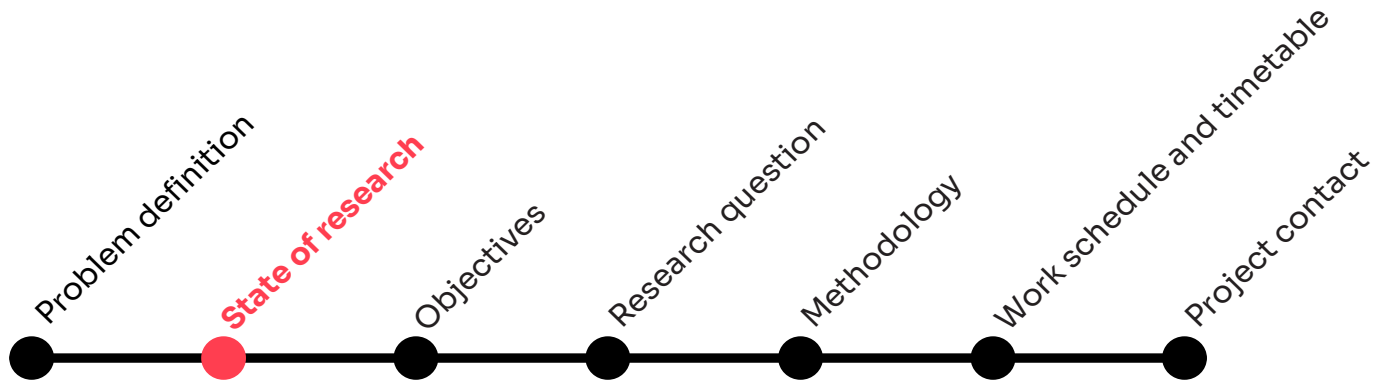
in a social context

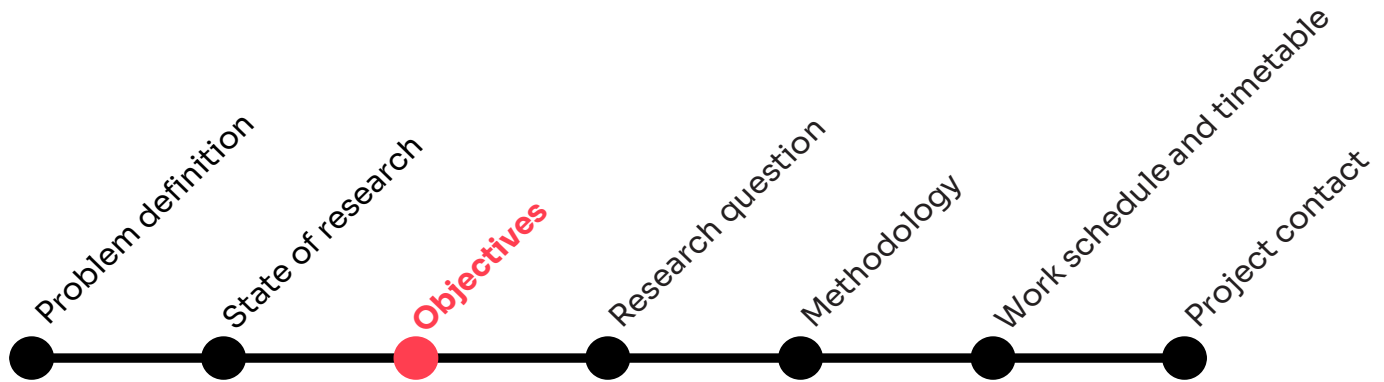


State of research

- _ the theoretical background

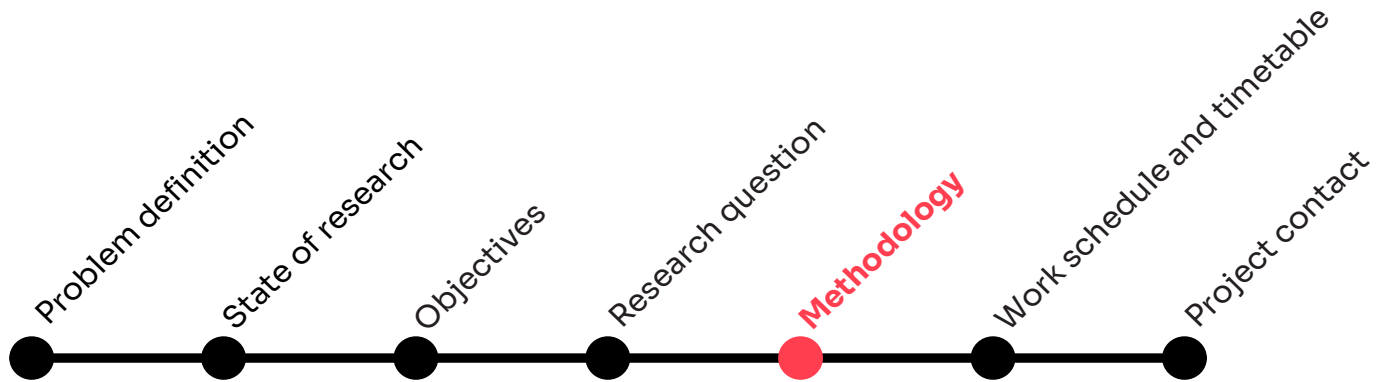


Research question

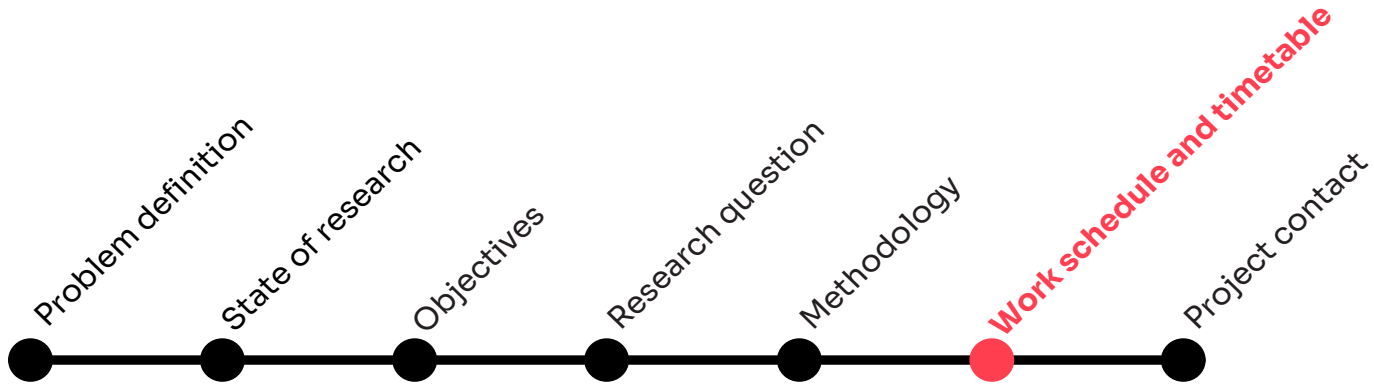
